Event overview

With the conclusion of the Government's public consultation, this seminar will set out the latest developments in the proposed Security of Payment Legislation and adjudication practice - a dispute resolution approach which is new to many and which will have significant impacts on sub-contract payments and others. Attendees can expect to understand the proposed changes in the contract payment mechanism which will work both ways when "pay-when-paid" arrangements are outlawed. The seminar will include a Q&A session to enable discussion of real life examples of payment disputes. Where there is sufficient interest, cases may be selected for mock trials in a separate adjudication workshop event.

About the speaker

Dr. Chee was the founder of the Hong Kong Construction Arbitration Centre (HKCAC) in 2006 with a focus on promoting best practice in construction dispute prevention and resolution through institutionalisation. HKCAC focuses on four areas of professionalism consisting of construction arbitration, mediation, adjudication and expert witness, promulgated through professional training, accreditation, listing, nomination and appointing, and regulation. Dr. Chee's publications include his doctoral thesis titled "From Right to Interest – Specialised Facilitative Mediation (Construction)", which discusses a wide range of forms of construction dispute resolution. He is a member of both the Development Bureau's Working Group on the Security of Payment Legislation and the Board of Practice of the Hong Kong Institute of Architects, and leads HKCAC's work looking at the development and implementation of the new legislation in the construction industry.
