Content	<p>HK’s construction industry was quite a traditional business back in the 1950s. Chinese-style family-run construction firms dominated the local market. Overseas contractors entered in a more influential way in the mid-1970s, by the time HK started the construction of the first MTR lines. Since then, overseas contractors bringing in with their expertise experience became more adaptive in the local market that formed a strong work force in the construction industry.</p> <p>Engineers belong to the younger generations may be quite unfamiliar with these names like inches/feet or ounces/pounds. The old system was gradually replaced by the metric system using metre and kilogram. Hand-mix concrete by nominal mix became ready-mix concrete based on precise mix design. The use of concrete hoist and labor-intensive method to place concrete can hardly be seen today. Concrete pump and tower crane are common equipment in most work sites. Traditional timber formwork was replaced in most situations by system formwork. Precast and prefabricated construction is quite a common trend nowadays. Needless to mention those mega structures both for building and civil project that work deep underground or high above in super-highrise towers. Zero-accident, environmental-friendly construction and quality are the common jargon of works. The complexity of work environment is so challenging beyond layman can imagine.</p> <p>With close to 40 years of experience in construction, the speaker reviews what the HK construction industry has gone through in the past 50 years. The evolution in the use of technology during these years and the front-line reality of mega projects will be highlighted as a major focus of this seminar.</p>
